MESSAGE FROM THE MD

Welcome to our Sixth Edition of the KSC Newsletter keeping you informed of the business progress, key projects, safety issues, key engagements and events undertaken from in and outside our company including key business highlights for 2022.



I would like to highlight the following key issues:

Safety

Safety continues to be our highest priority and it is our key success factor in our business, hence taken very seriously.

While we celebrated the Safety Award, awarded to the Company during the Leadership conference in Durban last year, we continue to remind all employees to continue being vigilant while at work and at home. As we draw towards the end of the season there is a tendency of complacency, particularly to employees working in the factory and the fields.

With the rainy seasons also progressing, every person driving motor vehicles is reminded to reduce speed and take into consideration the slippery roads to protect yourself and other road users. The other danger to be cautious about is lightning which has become prevalent in our localities with reports of people dying due to lightning strikes. In the event of rain and thunder, please observe the guidance provided by our SHERQ team which includes not taking shelter under trees or objects as they are prone to being struck by lightning.

Moreover, there have been a number of trees falling across the estate due to thunderstorms. Please take precaution by not standing under trees including parking of vehicles so as to mitigate the risk of being injured or causing damage to property in the event a tree falls.

While the cases of Covid-19 may not seem so obvious, the cases are still high in China and a few are still being diagnosed on the Estate. Employees are advised to take the necessary precautions as well as seek medical advice whenever one feels unwell/ill.

There has also been an increase of malaria cases on the estate to almost double since December 2022.

Employees are advised to keep their environments clean and clear stagnant water to prevent increase of mosquitoes. The use of mosquito nets is also highly encouraged to prevent bites at night.

Business Update

The 2022/23 production season is progressing very well.

The target for the season is to crush a total of 1,275,000 tons of cane. 625,000 tons from Kilombero Estate Agriculture (KEA) and 650,000 tons from the Kilombero Growers.

The budgeted sugar production for the season is 126,161 tons, with the sucrose target of 12.10% for both KEA and the Growers.

As at 30th December 2022 the total cane crushed amounted to 1,133,905 tons, out of which 555,613.45 tons have been delivered by Kilombero Growers and 555,613.45 tons tones by the Estate.

The total sugar packed as at 30th December 2022 was 118,563.92. To date we are ahead of our targeted sugar make due to the dry weather experienced up to the end of December 2022 and excellent factory performance in both crush rate and sugar recoveries.

The good factory performance has also been made possible by the steady cane supply from both Growers and the Estate with lower Burn-to-crush hours than budgeted, leading to smooth cane delivered to the factories.

This is a stellar performance, well done! to everyone!

Although there is stiff market competition from our competitors and the new entrant Bagamoyo Sugar, in the market, we continue to see a steady increase in demand for Bwana Sukari prepacks driven by our availability in the market along with strong brand campaigns.

Various commercial initiatives are ongoing in order to meet the consumer needs, such as market activations carried out in Singida region as well as supermarket activations. Production of 50 grams packet dubbed-"Project Mini", has commenced to meet affordability of our sugar to low-income earners. The 50 grams packet which will be sold at TZS 200 per packet.

Production of ethanol at the Distillery is also progressing well. The budgeted production for this year is 14,202kL of Extra Neutral Alcohol (ENA). As at 30th December 2022, actual production of 11,227kL ENA has been achieved

Expansion Update

The Kilombero Sugar Company team has worked tirelessly over the last year in kick-starting the expansion project.

A lot of work is currently taking place on site with structures now vividly seen. The project is being executed in three phases: Engineering, Procurement and construction. To-date, the overall expansion project progress has reached 35 percent. The project is expected to be completed in July 2024.

I would like to thank all our employees for your efforts and hard work in 2022 and appreciate the support extended by our stakeholders which have contributed to the success of the business to-date. I would like to request your continued support in this new year.

APPOINTMENT OF FIRST FEMALE PAN BOILER


As the Company strives to empower women within its workforce, it is also encouraging to see that some are courageous enough to take up challenging roles.

Aziza encourages others to grasp opportunities whenever available, as upon acquiring training, she is now able to perform her new role.



CHOPPER PROJECT KICKS OFF





In efforts to enhance efficiency in harvesting and delivery of cane to the mill, the company launched the Chopper harvester pilot project on the 1st August 2022.

The chopper comes along with various benefits which include:

- Increased efficiency mitigate delays in cane supply to the mills
- Ensure better cane quality
- Opportunity for technical jobs
- Reduce the amount of carbon emissions/greenhouse gases emitted caused by burning cane and in the long run mitigate the impact of climate change/global warming
- Preserve moisture on the ground through leaf trashes and prevent weeds from growing hence reducing the amount of herbicides to be applied.

Upon successful implementation of the project, the plan is to fully mechanize harvesting across the estate.

KSC SHINES AT LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE

At the end of every business financial year, the Illovo Africa Group convenes an Annual Leadership Conference. The previous years' Leadership conference was held at Drakensburg in Kwazulu-Natal from 14th - 17th September 2022.

The main objective of the visit was to better understand KSC's business including the ongoing expansion Project.




The event was a great platform for sugar cane growers and other stakeholders in the value chain to learn as well as showcase new farming technologies including sharing best management practices in sugar cane farming.




SMRI ACCOLADES

Their visit included brief updates on the progress of the expansion project, issues related to sourcing of workforce from nearby villages.

A tour to the project site was also conducted for them to get a picture of the progress as well as the magnitude of the project.

The local government leaders were appreciative of the initiatives held by the company in ensuring that they are informed on the business undertakings.



ANNUAL SAFETY ENGAGEMENT

The Company hosted the Annual safety stakeholder's forum on the 23rd of December 2022.

The forum's objective was to review the safety status throughout the year identify prevalent challenges and find mitigations to them.

The most common challenge on safety included theft of irrigation equipment from June to February each year simply because it is the period when there is no rain hence high demand of irrigation equipment because of the stress facing on sugar cane.

Mitigations to control this threat have been agreed with additional of field patrol cycles and enhancing communication amongst farm managers and Gardaworld to improve and put alert where critical operations are taking place e.g., irrigation, fertilizer applications etc.

Theft of private properties in residential/accommodation areas is another area of concern especially these days where there is an influx of job seekers due to K4 expansion project.

Seed cane theft continues to be a case especially after harvesting and during the rainy season (when rain starts) where the demand of seed cane from growers regularly becomes huge. KSC has set an internal procedure of selling seed cane driven by Kilombero Growers Department and Kilombero Estate Agriculture. Farm managers through neighborhood village meetings do address this as an agenda.

The forum was attended by our key stakeholders within and arounds the estate as well as the police force and local government authority.







HOSPITAL KICKS OFF FITNESS PROGRAM

Hospitals are known for their role of treating the sick and providing vaccines as a way of preventing infectious diseases. The current world trend of Non-Communicable Diseases (NCD)'s and death rate on NCD's has posed a threat to the wellbeing of people nationally but also to our Kilombero community, hence a need to change that norm.

Kilombero sugar community is also a victim of the NCD's world trend, whereby 35% of employees' deaths is caused by non-Communicable diseases whereas 10% of employees are suffering from cardiovascular illness and diabetes, while over 60% are in risk of these diseases.



As a response to this growing epidemic, the hospital team decided to cut off one of the major contributing factors - physical inactivity, by having a target of health weight range (18.5 to 24.9 BMI range) to all hospital staffs and become role models to other Kilombero employees. KSC hospital staff have set Saturday morning as their fitness time.

The Saturday schedule has also attracted staff from various departments who join the hospital team on their pursuit for increased life expectancy.

We appreciate the hospital team for setting a good example, well done and keep it up!

KIDS AND TEENS CHRISTMAS PARTY

To celebrate the end-of-year festive season, Kilombero Sugar Company hosted Christmas Parties for Children up to 12 years and for teens between 13 and 19 years.
